

Burning of Dayton Re-enactors Schedule: FINAL UPDATE
Thursday, March 27

9:00 a.m. sutlers and vendors set up tents. People who will be living in the constructed Village of Dayton prepare to move in. **We will need as many people as possible to set up the town today. No one may move in until the entire village is completed.**

Only those who helped build the town (to be burned on Sunday) and those who are the first 100 to register may live in the buildings until immediately after church service on Sunday.

Re-enactors, sutlers and vendors must register **upon arrival**. You will be given a parking pass, please park in designated area (limited temporary parking available for unloading only). Re-enactors will receive meal ticket for Saturday evening meal upon registration.
